strength of our regional photography community," said Nancy Glier, deputy director of FotoFocus. "The photos showcase our city and surrounding areas through a wide variety of images, which include charming, beautiful, funny, lyrical, abstract and manipulated photos.

Within this exhibition, there's something for everyone to connect with and enjoy." Nearly 300 entries were received for this year's contest, and 40 of those were selected for display. They range from iconic monuments to everyday moments. The exhibit is co-sponsored by the Photography Club of Greater Cincinnati and the Friends of the Public Library.
