Lens Mix 1: Roger Ross Williams and Lisa Cortés Thursday, October 1, 2020, 6pm EST

Join Academy Award-winning director, producer, and writer **Roger Ross Williams** and Academy Award-nominated producer **Lisa Cortés** for an hour-long Zoom conversation moderated by Kevin Moore. As audiences turn to documentary filmmaking for truthful and complex narratives told outside the scope of mainstream media, this conversation between Roger Ross Williams and Lisa Cortés, who collaborated most recently on *The Apollo* (2019), asks the question: what stories urgently need to be told in today's polarized and racialized political climate?

Williams was the first Black director to win an Academy Award, with his short documentary film *Music by Prudence* (2010). He has directed many critically acclaimed films, including the Academy Award-nominated *Life, Animated* (2016), which won the Sundance Film Festival Directing Award, and his recent HBO documentary about the iconic Harlem theater, *The Apollo*, which was the opening night film of the 2019 Tribeca Film Festival. His production company, One Story Up, is currently in production on a feature-length adaptation of Ta-Nehisi Coates' *Between The World and Me* for HBO, an untitled documentary about civil rights lawyer Ben Crump, and a short film series with Topic and First Look Media. Williams is currently in pre-production on his first narrative feature film for Amazon studios, *Cassandro*, starring Gael García Bernal.

Cortés is renowned for creating challenging, visionary stories and has been distinguished by her commitment to empowering inclusive voices. She was the executive producer of *Precious* (2009)

and recently worked with Williams as producer on *The Apollo* (2019). Her directorial debut, *The Remix: Hip Hop X Fashion* (2019), traces the impact of street fashion and African American creativity on global cultural trends and was recently released on Netflix. *All In: The Fight For Democracy*, which she co-directed with Liz Garbus and produced with Stacey Abrams, Dan Cogan and Garbus will be released by Amazon Studios in fall 2020.

FotoFocus is a Cincinnati-based nonprofit arts organization that champions photography and lens-based art through exhibitions and public programming. Since 2010, the organization has engaged art and educational institutions throughout the region to support and expand the cultural dialogue around the medium that has come to define our time.

With an emphasis on intellectually and academically rigorous programs, the organization provides uniquely enriching access to lens-based art, film, and practices inspired by photography. FotoFocus has collaborated with hundreds of organizations, curators, academics, and artists to present more than 700 exhibitions and programs, having contributed funding for the majority. The organization has brought hundreds of internationally-renowned photographers to the Greater Cincinnati region.

Signature programming includes: FotoFocus Biennial, which had a record-breaking 207,000 visitors in 2018 and has presented exhibitions of work by both historic and contemporary artists such as Berenice Abbott, Eugène Atget, Roe Ethridge, Zanele Muholi, Karl Blossfeldt, Francis Bruguière, Thomas Ruff, and Akram Zaatari in Cincinnati; the FotoFocus Symposium, which has contributed significant dialogue and insight to culturally relevant topics including the controversial Mapplethorpe exhibition; and FotoFocus Lecture and Visiting Artist Series, which has brought internationally renowned artists, such as Zoe Leonard and William Wegman, to Cincinnati.

In April 2020, in response to the Covid-19 pandemic, FotoFocus pledged its 2020 Biennial budget to financially support more than 100 Participating Venues and Partners in the region's art community through FotoFocus Emergency Art Grants.
